NOTES:

1. Summer school tuition is discounted to \$400.00 per semester hour of credit. Room charges are separate. Contact the Student Affairs Office for updated housing information.
2. Students must complete registration in the Business Office (tuition payment), Student Affairs (for students residing on campus during the summer), Financial Aid, and Registrar's Office. Tuition payment must be made to the Business Office by the first day of the block in which the class is taken.
3. Drop/add, and withdrawal from class for summer school are identical to the policies for regular academic year.
4. Students may register for summer school sessions starting on February 19, 2008 by completing the 2008 Summer Registration form. Registration must be completed no later than the first day of the summer block in which the course is to be taken.
5. This is not a final schedule, but simply the most current schedule available. Historically, faculty have added and deleted courses right until the day summer school starts. Contact the Registrar's Office for updates.
