## LENOIR-RHYNE BEARS AT TUSCULUM PIONEERS

### PIONEER SHOTS

- Tusculum leads the SAC in 3-point field goal percentage (.397), rebounding defense (30.9 rpg), rebounding margin (+3.3), assist/turnover margin (1.09) and 3-point field goals made (9.42).
- Jordan Lear is one of 16 players in recorded school history to score 1,000 points. He enters tonight's game with 1,399 points to his credit (7th in school history).
- Lear has scored in 73 straight games and in 99 of his 100 career contests. The only game he didn't record a point was against Carson-Newman in the opening game of the 2005 Food Lion South Atlantic Conference Tournament.
- Lear has recorded a rebound in 41 straight games and in 99 of his 100 career appearances. He didn't post a board at Brevard in last year's season opener.
- Lear has 522 to his credit, which is ninth all-time at TC.
- Lear is averaging 12.8 points per game in his eight career meetings against Lenoir-Rhyne.
- Kyle Moore opened the season making his first 24 free throws without a miss.
- Moore leads the SAC in free throw percentage (.885), 3-point percentage (.452) and 3-point field goals per game (3.68).
- Tusculum's losses have come against teams with a combined 130-70 record (.650).
- When Lavonti Jeter plays for at least 30 minutes, the Pioneers are 4-1 this season.
- Lear recorded a career-high 18 rebounds against West Virginia Tech, the fourth-best board tally in school history.
- Tusculum has made a 3-point field goal in 572 consecutive games.
- Lear has recorded a three-point field goal in 21 straight games, dating back to last season. During that 21-game run, he has shot 57-for-134 from beyond the arc (42.5%).
- Tusculum head coach Jim Boone enters today's game with 356 career victories, which are 35th most amongst active NCAA Division II coaches.
- Since the 2001-02 season, Tusculum is 49-9 when scoring 80 or more points, including 3-1 this year.
- Lenoir-Rhyne leads the SAC in scoring defense (67.2 ppg), scoring margin (+9.6), field goal percentage (.488) and 3-point percentage defense (.290).
- L-R's Reggie Bratton is averaging 11.9 points per game in his eight career contests against Tusculum.

### TUSCULUM HOSTS SAC-LEADING BEARS

The second half of the South Atlantic Conference tips off this afternoon as the Tusculum Pioneers (8-11, 2-5 SAC) host the league-leading Lenoir-Rhyne Bears (14-3, 7-0 SAC).

The Pioneers fell in the final moments of the game in Wednesday's 62-61 home loss to Mars Hill. The Lions took their first and only lead of the evening on a lay-up with 0.3 seconds remaining as MHC snuck away with the one-point victory. Sophomore guard **Kyle Moore** led the Pioneers with 21 points, including five 3-pointers.

Lenoir-Rhyne enters today's contest riding a seven-game winning streak, all in conference play, including Wednesday's pivotal 72-68 road win at Wingate. The Bears overcame an early 19-point deficit to maintain its stranglehold on first place in the SAC.

L-R's seven-game winning streak began a month ago when the Bears defeated Tusculum 77-64 in this season's first meeting.

The Pioneers continue to boast the top three-point shooting attack in the league, averaging 9.42 three-point field goals per game (16th in NCAA II), while shooting a SAC-best 39.4 percent from beyond the arc (38th in NCAA II).

Senior forward **Jordan Lear**, a Preseason All-SAC selection, leads the Pioneers in scoring (18.4 ppg - 3rd in SAC/45th in NCAA II) and rebounding (7.1 rpg - 6th in SAC). He is shooting 49.6 percent from the floor (13th in SAC), including 42 percent from three-point land (5th in SAC).

Lear has posted 1,399 points so far during his TC career (7th in school history). He has also accounted for 522 rebounds at Tusculum, which are ninth all-time.

Moore, a transfer from Winthrop, is second on the squad in scoring, averaging 17.2 points per game (7th in SAC). Moore leads the conference in three-pointers made (3.68), 3-point percentage (.452) and free throw percentage (.885). Moore has posted a three-point field goal in 10 straight games.

Sophomore guard **Jimmy Boone** is third with his 11.2 points per game average (22nd in SAC), including his career-best 21 markers against L-R in this year's first encounter. He has made a three-pointer in 17 of his 19 outings this year, averaging 2.16 treys per game (9th in SAC), while shooting 40.2 percent from long-range (10th in SAC).

Senior forward **Lavonti Jeter** is fourth on the team, averaging 9.9 points per contest (27th in SAC), while shooting a team-best 59.2 percent from the floor (3rd in SAC).

Junior guard **Ryan Troutman**, a transfer from St. Catherine's College, has worked his way into the starting line-up in the last seven games. He leads the team in assists (4.58 apg - 4th in SAC) and is tops in the SAC in assists/turnover ratio (2.07). He's averaging 10 points per game in his last five outings. During that five-game span, he is also shooting 86 percent (24-for-28) from the free throw line, while averaging 5.4 rebounds and 5.2 helpers a contest.

### HEAD COACH JIM BOONE

Jim Boone is in his third season as the head men's basketball coach at Tusculum College.

Boone has over quarter of a century of collegiate coaching experience, including the last 22 years as a head coach. He has recorded 356 victories, including 263 wins at the NCAA Division II level. His 356 wins are currently ranked 35th in NCAA II history. In his first year in Greeneville, he guided the Pioneers to a 14-15 record, including the program's third trip to the Food Lion South Atlantic Conference Tournament semifinal in four years.

His 228-71 record at the California University of Pennsylvania gave Boone a .763 winning percentage, which at the time was the second best success rate of active Division II coaches.

In his 10 seasons at California, Boone led the Vulcans to seven postseason appearances. California advanced to six NCAA Tournaments, posting an impressive 12-4 record, including a pair of NCAA Final Four appearances.

His 1992 team went 31-2 and was the No. 1 ranked team in the final NCAA II poll. That squad captured the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference Championship and moved onto the first of two NCAA Final Fours.

Boone, a native of Winfield, W.Va., spent the next five seasons as the head coach at NCAA Division I Eastern Michigan University where he compiled a 48-96 mark. His squads continued to make progress each year during his tenure, including the Eagles 14-14 mark in 2002-03 an eight-win improvement from the season before.

Prior to working at EMU, he served four years as the head coach at Robert Morris University. He built the Colonials into a winner following seasons of 4-23 and 8-19, as he guided Robert Morris to a 15-12 mark in 1998-99 and 18-12 in 1999-00. That 2000 squad advanced to the NEC Championship Game and came up one step shy of advancing to the NCAA Tournament.

During his career, his teams have recorded 17 or more wins on 12 occasions, including six conference championships, four tournament titles, seven national post season appearances.

From 1990-96, his California teams recorded over 20 victories for six consecutive years tallying an impressive 150-33 mark during that span. His 94-24 league record in the PSAC is still the best of any coach in that conference's history.

He was named PSAC Coach of the Year on three occasions (1988, 1992, 1996) and NCAA Region Coach Year twice (1992, 1996).

In 2005, Boone was inducted to the California University of Pennsylvania Sports Hall of Fame.

Boone played his collegiate basketball at West Virginia State College where he was a four-year letterman. He earned his Bachelor's degree in Accounting from WVSC in 1981 and followed that with a MBA from the University of Kentucky in 1982 with a concentration in Marketing.

He began his coaching career at his alma mater where he served as the head assistant coach from 1982-85. Boone spent one season as the head assistant coach at Charleston Southern University as the Buccaneers won the 1986 Big South Conference Championship.

He is married to the former Stephanie VanVranken and they are the parents of two sons, Jimmy, 19 and Joey, 17. In 2006, Jimmy is a sophomore on the Pioneer Basketball Team.

### TUSCULUM'S LAST GAME

Mars Hill 62, Tusculum 61

January 30, 2008

**GREENEVILLE, Tenn.** --- P.J. Gore's lay-up with 0.3 seconds gave Mars Hill the lead for the first and only time as the Lions edged host Tusculum, 62-61 at Pioneer Arena in South Atlantic Conference men's basketball action.

**Jordan Skinner** led all scorers with 23 points off the bench for the Lions, including 14-of-15 from the free throw line. Jamarl Glenn added 14 markers, while Gore tallied five points, including the winning basket.

Tusculum's **Kyle Moore** posted 21 points, including five 3-pointers, while Jordan Lear added 14 points and seven rebounds in the loss. The contest was plagued by a combined 55 personal fouls (TC 31, MHC 24), which saw four players foul out (TC 3, MHC 1), including Tusculum starters Lear and **Lavonti Jeter**.

The Lions trailed throughout the entire contest, with Tusculum holding its largest lead at 40-26 with 16 minutes remaining in the game. TC held a 55-46 advantage with 3:07 left, following a jumper by **Ryan Troutman** with the shot clock running down. MHC trimmed the deficit to three (55-49) when Moton drained a three-pointer with 2:32 remaining in the contest.

With Tusculum leading 59-54, the Lions trimmed the TC advantage to one (59-58) thanks to four straight free throws by Skinner, including the last pair with 55.2 seconds left.

Moore was fouled and the sophomore made two free throws to move the Pioneers back out to a three-point lead (61-58). Glen was fouled for Mars Hill and he canned his two free throws with 45 seconds left to bring MHC back to within one (61-60).

Tusculum worked the clock down to 22.2 seconds and called a timeout near midcourt, but on the ensuing inbounds pass, the Pioneers were whistled for five seconds, turning the ball over to the Lions. After a MHC timeout, the Lions worked for the last shot as Glen dribbled to the lane and dished off the ball to a streaking Gore from the right side and made the lay-up with less than a second remaining.

The Pioneers attempted to draw a foul on the in-bounds pass, but none was called as Skinner stole the pass to seal the victory.

Tusculum shot 44 percent from the floor, while limiting the Lions to 28 percent, including 5-of-28 (18%) in the first half as the Pioneers led 32-21 at the break.

The Lions shot 24-for-31 from the free throw line, while making its final six charity stripe attempts in the final 88 seconds.

The Pioneers committed 23 turnovers, including 11 on TC offensive fouls.

### LENOIR-RHYNE'S LAST GAME

Lenoir-Rhyne 72, Wingate 68

January 28, 2008

**WINGATE, N.C.** --- The Lenoir-Rhyne College men's basketball team (14-3, 7-0) rallied from a 19-point deficit to win its seventh straight game, 72-68, over Wingate University (14-5, 5-2) in a pivotal South Atlantic Conference game at Cuddy Arena.

Lenoir-Rhyne, who won despite falling behind 24-5 to start the game, remained the lone unbeaten team in league play.

The Bears entered the game ranked fifth in the NCAA Division II South Atlantic Regional Poll while the Bulldogs were fourth. L-R now has a two-game lead over Wingate and Carson-Newman in the SAC standings.

Senior forward **Josh Kindred** (Holly Springs, N.C./Fuquay-Varina HS) tallied a double-double (14 points and 10 rebounds) while senior

forward **Reggie Bratton** (Charlotte, N.C./West Charlotte HS) and junior guard **Josh Rudder** (Graham, N.C./Southern Alamance HS) added 13 points apiece for the Bears, who started 7-0 in SAC play for the first time in four years.

Bratton scored all 13 of his points in the second half in the win. Wingate's **Sean Barnette** (Rock Hill, S.C.) finished with a game-high 20 points and 11 rebounds and **Bryan Grier** (Charlotte, N.C.) added a double-double (14 points and 12 rebounds) despite the loss.

### THE LAST TIME THEY MET

Lenoir-Rhyne 77, Tusculum 64

January 5, 2008

**HICKORY, N.C.** --- **Reggie Bratton** recorded 17 points to lead the Lenoir-Rhyne men's basketball team to a 77-64 win over visiting Tusculum at Shuford Memorial Gymnasium in South Atlantic Conference action.

Tusculum sophomore **Jimmy Boone** recorded a career-high 21 points, shooting 8-for-13 from the floor, including five 3-pointers. Senior Jordan Lear added 17 points, while **Kyle Moore** finished with 13 markers. Junior **Ryan Troutman** finished with five points and a game-high seven assists.

L-R's **Josh Rudder** tallied 15 points, while **Jonathan Cook** and **Josh Kindred** added 14 and 11 points, respectively.

The Bears led 36-31 at halftime, but Tusculum got back-to-back three-pointers by Boone to tie the contest at 37-37. L-R answered with an 8-0 run in the opening moments of the second period to take a 45-37 advantage, capped off by a three-point play by **Donte' Watson**.

With L-R leading 49-39, Boone and Lear added three-pointers to cut the deficit to 49-45. The Bears moved out to a nine-point advantage (56-47), but Tusculum answered with a 9-3, including a pair of free throws by **Lavonti Jeter** as L-R led 58-55 with six minutes remaining in the game.

Lenoir-Rhyne scored eight unanswered points, including four markers by Bratton as the Bears moved ahead by 11 (66-55) with 3:55 left on the clock. Lear followed with a three-pointer for the Pioneers to cut the deficit to eight, but that's as close as Tusculum would get.

L-R shot 57 percent from the floor, including 8-for-19 from three-point territory. Tusculum shot 42 percent from the field, including a blistering 13-for-27 (48%) from beyond the arc. TC out-rebounded the Bears by a 31-21 margin, including 13-4 on the offensive glass, but L-R forced 21 Pioneer turnovers.

## FROM WAY DOWNTOWN

The Pioneers continue to lead the South Atlantic Conference in both three-pointers made per game (9.4) and percentage (.393).

So far this year, Tusculum has accounted for two of the best shooting performances from beyond the arc in school history.

In the season-opener against Bellarmine, TC shot 10-for-16 from downtown (62.5%), which is tied for second in school history.

In Tusculum's 74-60 win over NCAA Division I Elon, the Pioneers shot a sizzling 13-for-21 from three-point land for 61.9 percent, the fourth best in TC history.

## ALL IN THE FAMILY

Two families have more than one representative on this year's Tusculum men's basketball team. Head coach **Jim Boone** is beginning his third season in Greeneville and second coaching his oldest son **Jimmy**.

Besides the Boone Family, the Pioneers also have a set of brothers on this year's squad in **Ryan** and **Robert Troutman**.

## LOVING THE 80'S

When the Pioneers get into the 80's, their chances of winning have been pretty good of late.

Since 2001-02, the Pioneers are an amazing 49-9 when scoring 80 points, including 3-2 this season.

TC was 5-0 last year when scoring 80-plus. During the 2005-06 campaign, TC went 8-2, 2004-05, the Pioneers were 13-6 and a perfect 9-0 the year before that.

TC had a remarkable string come to an end in an 83-82 home loss to Lincoln Memorial (Dec. 2, 2004). That loss halted a 25-game winning streak when TC scored 80 or more points. Prior to that setback, the last time TC lost a game when it scored 80 or more was in the 2000-01 regular season finale when they dropped a 92-84 home decision to No. 7 Wingate.

## HOT IN THE 90'S

The Pioneers broke the 90-point barrier on seven occasions in 2004-05 and four times the following season.

On Dec. 9, 2005 in a 121-91 loss to No. 22 West Liberty State, marked the first time in five years that the Pioneers eclipsed 90 points and lost. The last time TC lost when scoring 90 points was Dec. 4, 2000 in a 102-93 road setback at Virginia-Wise.

Over the last four seasons, the Pioneers have scored over 90 points 13 times, including 100 points vs. Wingate in 2004, 116 against Wingate (Feb. 5, 2005), 100 vs. North Greenville (Feb. 7, 2005), 101 at Carson-Newman (Feb. 16, 2005) and 100 points vs. Wingate (Jan. 7, 2006).

## 572 & COUNTING

Since the inception of the three-point shot in 1987, Tusculum College has taken full advantage of that weapon. The Pioneers have hit at least one three-pointer in 572 straight games entering today's game.

Tusculum's 500th consecutive outing with a three-pointer came on Nov. 19, 2005 at Lander University.

Over the past 572 games, TC has made 4,223 three-pointers averaging out to 7.38 treys per game. The Pioneers made their 3,000th trifecta vs. Mars Hill five years ago (Feb. 20, 2002).

Tusculum has scored 12,669 points from beyond the arc since the creation of the three-point shot. The Pioneers posted its 10,000th point from three-point land when **Douglas Tshomba** (Brussels, Belgium) drilled a "3" in the second half against No. 1 Southern Indiana (Dec. 30, 2003).

Over the last 20 years, Tusculum has been limited to only one 3-pointer on three occasions, including last season against Lincoln Memorial (Feb. 3, 2007) when TC shot 1-for-12 from beyond the arc. Despite that, Tusculum won 61-58.

Another one 3-point field contest came was Jan. 20, 1996 when the Pioneers only made one trey at NCAA Division I Wofford College.

TC was also held to only two 3-point field goals at Lenoir-Rhyne (Jan. 12, 2002). That L-R game was also TC's 400th consecutive game with a trey.

### KING LEAR

Zanesville, Ohio forward **Jordan Lear** has emerged as one of Tusculum's top scorers. This season, he is averaging 18.4 points per game.

Lear achieved a personal milestone at Lenoir-Rhyne last season, reaching the 1,000-point plateau for his career. He became the 16th player in recorded history with 1,000 points in a Pioneer uniform. Lear is seventh all-time in scoring with 1,399 points.

He enjoyed his best outing in a Pioneer uniform earlier this season with his career-high 33 points at Brevard (Dec. 1, 2007). He shot 11-for-17 from the field, including a career-high seven 3-pointers.

He was a menace on the glass against West Virginia Tech (Nov. 23, 2007) as he hauled in a career-high 18 rebounds the fourth-best rebound tally ever by a Pioneer.

Lear earned SAC Player of the Week honors on Jan. 14. He canned a game-clinching lay-up in the final seconds of Tusculum 67-64 win over Concord (Jan. 7). He followed that five days later by draining a 25-foot three-pointer with 1.3 seconds left in Tusculum's 82-79 home win over Catawba (Jan. 12).

Against Ouachita Baptist (Dec. 1, 2006) last year, Lear scored the winning basket with 2.4 seconds left in the game in a 65-63 victory in the opening game of the Sodexo Shootout in Charlotte.

In 2005-06, Lear led TC averaging 14.4 points per game, which was fourth in the South Atlantic Conference. He poured in a season-high 30 points in a road win at Lander (Nov. 19, 2005). In that game, he shot 11-for-16 from the floor and 3-of-6 from three-point land. He preceded that performance with 21 markers against Georgia College & State University (Nov. 18, 2005).

Lear added 26 points in Tusculum's 80-76 home win over Bluefield College (Nov. 30, 2005) and followed that with a double-double of 22 points and 11 rebounds at Lincoln Memorial (Dec. 3). Against LMU, Lear connected on the winning basket with 19 seconds left in a 61-59 win over the Railsplitters.

The SAC All-Freshman Team honoree scored in double-figures 19 times and was one of the top players on the team shooting 80.1 percent from the charity stripe. His 46.3 percent field goal shooting was also listed amongst the leaders in the league.
