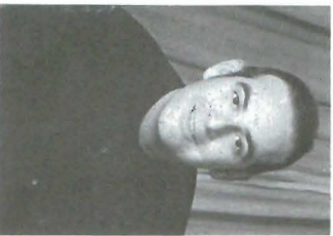
Christian Principles for Managing Finances will be the focus of the 2003 Theologian-in-Residence lecture series.

Tusculum College and Holston Presbytery will be welcoming four speakers from Crown Financial Ministries to discuss various aspects of sound financial management based on Biblical principles.

Beginning the 13th year of the popular lecture series on Feb. 4 will be **Ervin Barham**, who will provide an overview of Biblical stewardship. His topics will include basic budgeting principles and training budget counselors. Barham, a self-employed pension consultant who lives in the Charlotte, N.C. area, learned of Crown Financial Ministries when he and his wife found themselves in deep financial debt as newllyweds. Barham says that God, in His sovereign grace, mercy and provision, cleaned up the financial mess, using the Biblical principles as taught by Crown Financial Ministries to do so.

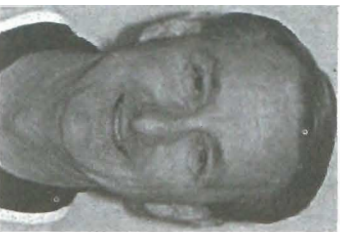


Chuck Coker, will address "Business by the Book" on Feb. 11. This session will address what the Bible teaches about business principles and how teaching these principles can develop leaders within a church. Coker is city director of Charlotte, N.C., for Crown Financial Ministries, is a trained

On February 18, **Michael Smith** will be addressing "Ownership verses Stewardship." Smith will also address what the Bible says about contentment as well as Christ's different teaching methods (large group, one-on-one, and small group). Included in Smith's lecture will be information about the Crown Financial Ministries small group study. The final session of the series on Feb. 25 will be led by **Fred Bumpass**. Bumpass has public accounting experience ranging from a large local firm to a two-man partnership and built a successful practice as a sole practitioner. In 1988, Bumpass was introduced to the then Crown Ministries Small Group Study.
