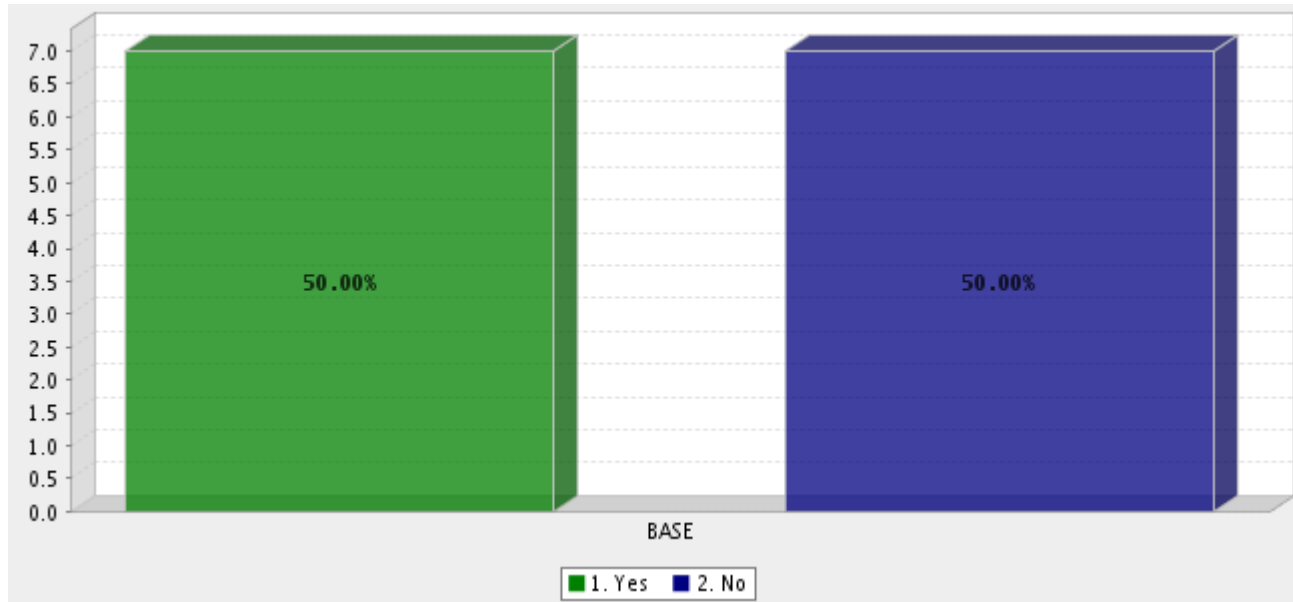
Do you own handheld e-book reader or iPad?



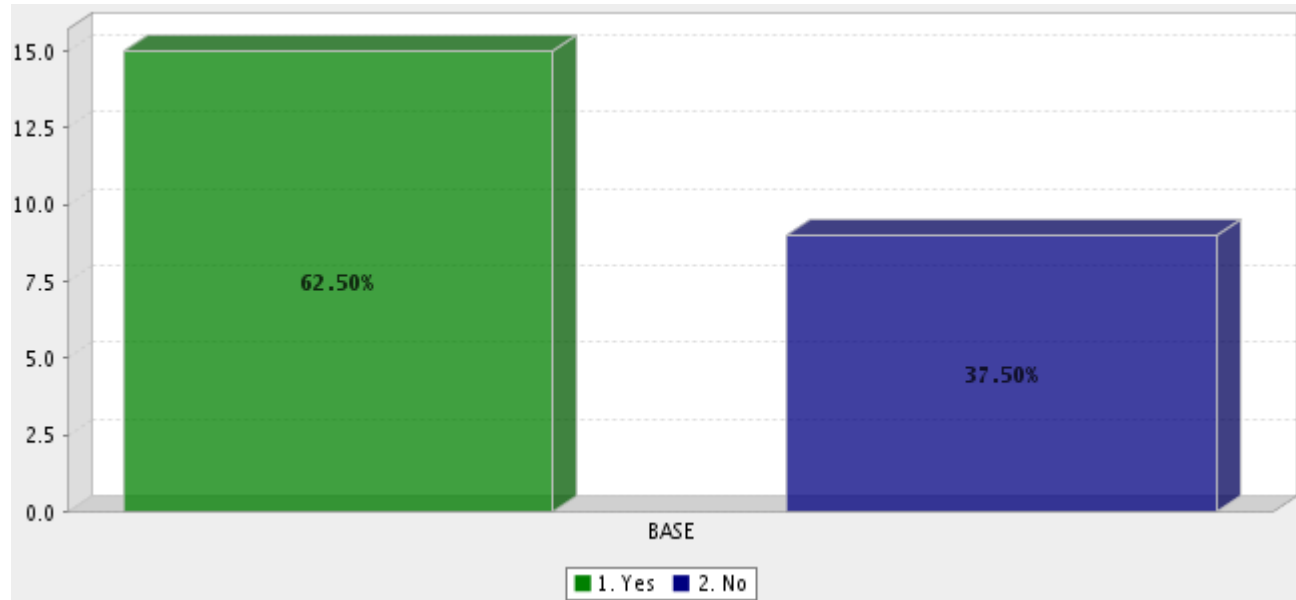

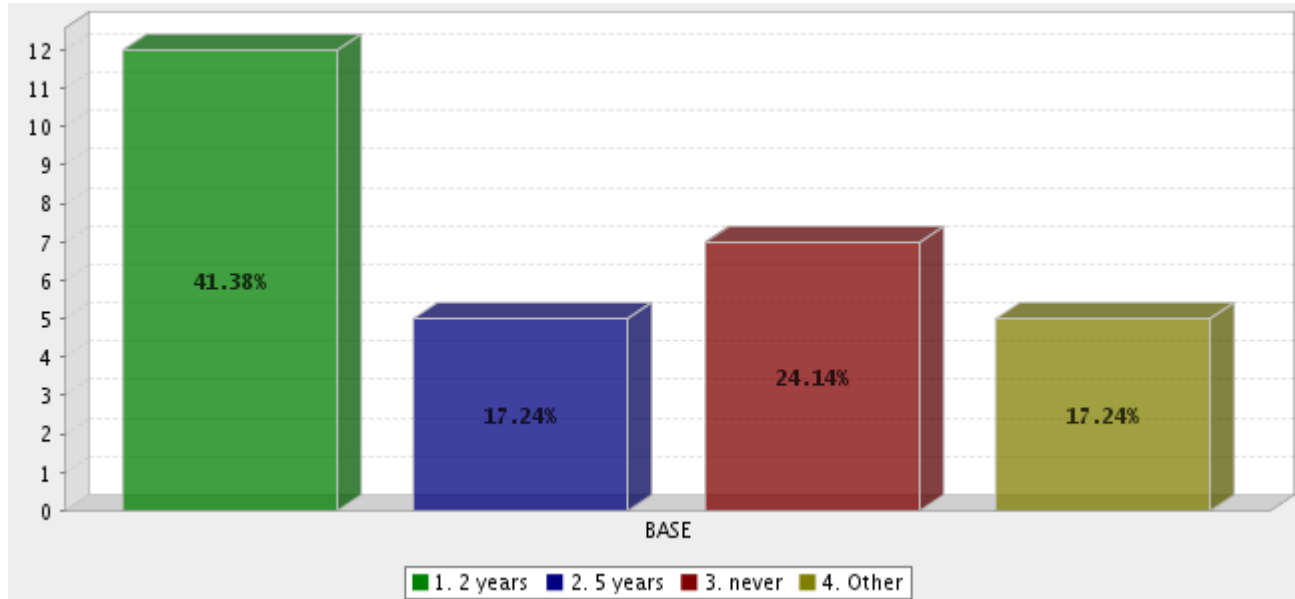
